What does the Holy Spirit reveal to me in light of this? • How does the command connect to the story? • What is God saying to me (or what should I obey) & what am I going to do about it? • Do I have any fears, doubts, or resistance in keeping this command? • What does this command reveal about the condition of my heart – what do I really believe and what do I really want?
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
